Please receive our high-level report on the Khoe- and San Land Summit Resolutions. The Summit delegates entrusted the initial implementation of the tasks to Indigenous First Nation Advocacy South Africa (IFNASA) until such time that a full Team has been established to implement all the resolutions. IFNASA therefore is only an “**Interim Custodian**” of processing the resolutions and will be “**Replaced**” once the “First Nation People” appointed or nominated a National Convening Team. Importantly, “**NO**” leadership positions were chosen at the Land Summit which had five provinces represented, although in small numbers. The provinces are: “Western Cape, Eastern Cape, Northern Cape, Kwa-Zulu Natal and Gauteng as the host province. The Summit realized that a much broader representation is needed across the organizations, groupings, individuals and institutions; hence the next San and Khoe Land Summit will be hosted in the Western Cape, the city of Cape Town from the 29th August – 2nd September 2018.

It gives us great please at IFNASA to be part of the next level of our Nation’s Liberation. The resolutions were captured by **Leader Gordon Cassim, Khoeses Sharon Gabie** and finalised by **Anthony Phillip Williams**.
